'Patient Voice - a Vital Part of All-Island Cancer Research'

A patient stakeholder workshop from the All-Island Cancer Research Institute & the Patient Voice in Cancer Research.

We invite patients and carers from across the island of Ireland to participate in this workshop either in-person or online.

The main objective of the AICRI Patient Workshop is to explain what the All-Island Cancer Research Institute (AICRI) and the Patient Voice in Cancer Research (PVCR) are and to explore ways how patients can engage with and contribute to AICRI and the PVCR.

Registration and refreshments (3:30pm to 4pm)

Workshop (4pm to 6pm)

Panel discussions followed by a Q&A covering the various themes.

Four themes will be covered in the workshop

- 1) An overview of AICRI and PVCR and a description of their key priorities over the next five years.
- 2) Explore how patients can get involved in AICRI and contribute to this new large-scale activity in cancer research.
- 3) Discuss barriers experienced by patients when engaging with cancer researchers.
- 4) Identify the impact of patient involvement in cancer research, such as patient representation on advisory boards and committees, contribution to research journal articles, etc.

Outcomes from workshop

- 1) Better understand of how AICRI, PVCR and patients can engage and collaborate with each other going forward.
- 2) Identify barriers encountered by patients when trying to engage with cancer researchers.
- 3) Build a network of patients for AICRI and PVCR to help tackle cancer together across the island of Ireland.

A workshop report will be produced which will cover the points outlined above.

This will be a hybrid event. The in-person event will take place in the Radisson Hotel, Little Island, Cork. The event will also be hosted online.

Patients participating in-person will be encouraged to attend the '*Prof. Patrick G. Johnston Award for Excellence in Cancer Research Outreach*' lay seminar event which will occur after the workshop from 6:15pm-7.15pm as part of the IACR (Irish Association for Cancer Research) Annual Conference 2022.
