Message from our Co-Chairs

Cancer represents an impending global health crisis unless we act with urgency. This has been exacerbated by the impact of the Covid pandemic, with >100 million cancer screening tests not performed and >1 million cancer diagnoses missed in Europe. Similar data exist for the US, emphasising the global nature of the challenge. The EU-US summit in 2021 marked the beginning of a renewed transatlantic partnership, setting a joint agenda for Europe-US cooperation in the post-pandemic era.

Europe's Beating Cancer Plan, Cancer Mission and European Cancer Groundshot have clear compatibilities with the US Cancer Moonshot and National Cancer Plan, providing unparalleled opportunities to foster further cooperation between two global powerhouses of cancer research and care, to jointly address one of the greatest challenges in human health. Stronger links have been developing including between the European Cancer Organisation (ECO) and the American Society for Clinical Oncology (ASCO), through joint programmes addressing cancer inequalities and the impact of the War in Ukraine on cancer, demonstrating the appetite for joint Euro-American collaboration. The European School of Oncology (ESO) and the US National Cancer Institute (NCI) also represent major players in this transatlantic effort.

The island of Ireland has been a focus for transatlantic cooperation in cancer research and care, through the Ireland-Northern Ireland-NCI Cancer Consortium, an unheralded product of the Good Friday Agreement. The Consortium has delivered world-class research and better care for patients, by nurturing collaboration between researchers, patients, physicians, and allied health professionals. This work was presented at the Science Summit of the United Nations General Assembly in New York in 2023, where it was widely hailed as an international exemplar of the health dividend of peace.

The Consortium, the brainchild of Professor Paddy Johnston, who had worked at the NCI and saw the unique opportunity for the island of Ireland, celebrates its 25th Anniversary this year. Its impact has been significant – over 35,000 patients entered onto clinical trials on the island, saving thousands of lives and enhancing the quality of life of many more. Holding this significant Euro-American event on the island of Ireland, resonates both with the strong relationship that already exists with our US counterparts, the 25th anniversary of the Consortium, but also particularly given that 2024 marks the 20-year anniversary of when Ireland became the first country in the world to introduce a ban on smoking in the workplace, catalysing a global movement in public health and cancer prevention. Given that one of the areas of focus of the recently established EU – US Health Taskforce is lung cancer, the synergy with the introduction of the ban is significant. Hence the choice of lung cancer along with cancer inequalities among the key themes of the Forum.

Forum event partners



Over the last 3 years, the **All-Island Cancer Research Institute (AICRI)** has brought together 10 academic institutions across the island of Ireland, along with other stakeholders, to develop an overarching framework for cancer research covering prevention, diagnosis, treatment and survivorship/quality of life. Significant funding to kick-start this rapidly expanding and inclusive virtual institute has been received from the North-South Research Programme (NSRP), run by the Higher Education Authority of Ireland via funding under the Shared Island Initiative.

AICRI is focused both on deepening North-South collaboration, strengthening the social and economic links on the island of Ireland, but also on linking with international colleagues in other parts of Europe, the US and further afield to benefit cancer patients and wider society.



The **European Cancer Organisation (ECO)** is the largest non-profit, multiprofessional federation in Europe. It brings together hundreds of different professional societies and patient groups to advocate for more effective, efficient, and equitable cancer care.



Founded in 1964, the **American Society of Clinical Oncology, Inc. (ASCO®)** is committed to the principle that knowledge conquers cancer and, together with the Association for Clinical Oncology, represents nearly 50,000 oncology professionals who care for people living with cancer.



The **National Cancer Institute (NCI)** is the federal government's principal agency for cancer research and training. Established under the National Cancer Institute Act of 1937, NCI is part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), one of 11 agencies that make up the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). NCI's mission is to lead, conduct, and support cancer research across the nation to advance scientific knowledge and help all people live longer, healthier lives. As the leader of the cancer research enterprise, collectively known as the National Cancer Program, and the largest funder of cancer research in the world, NCI manages a broad range of research, training, and information dissemination activities that reach across the entire country, meeting the needs of all demographics—rich and poor, urban and rural, and all racial/ethnic populations The NCI is the US partner in the tripartite Ireland - Northern Ireland - NCI Cancer Consortium.

The **European School of Oncology (ESO)** is an independently funded non-profit organisation dedicated to quality education and training. ESO's vision is to ensure that all cancer patients have access to unbiased and evidence-based competent care from adequately trained health professionals.



The **Department of Health** has more than 600 employees working together across multiple divisions and units to deliver on a very broad mission and mandate. The functions of the Department of Health are to serve the public and support the Minister for Health, Ministers of State, and the Government:

- by providing leadership and policy direction for the health sector to improve health outcomes,
- by undertaking effective governance and performance oversight to ensure accountable and high-quality services and systems,
- by collaborating to achieve health priorities and contribute to wider social and economic goals and

Established in 2007, the NCCP works with health service providers and other partners to prevent cancer, treat cancer, and increase survival and quality of life for those who develop cancer, by converting the knowledge gained through research, surveillance and outcome evaluation into strategies and actions. In particular, the NCCP is responsible for the implementation of the majority of the recommendations of the government's National Cancer Strategies, which are published approximately every ten years.
